The Young Co-operative movement gives young people a practical introduction to enterprise by helping them to set up their own businesses. Our Year 7 students, supported by Year 13 business students, are starting an apple juice business using apples from our own orchard. This young co-operative is not just made up of students but is supported by our Year 7 transition team and Helen Harris our horticultural lead teacher.



These Young people will take control of their own business - picking and pricing stock, researching markets, devising promotional materials, cash management and so on. Our Young Cooperative produces a business plan to set the agenda for their future development. Through Young Co-operatives young people learn to work with one another. Each member has an equal stake in the business and an equal opportunity to contribute and make decisions. They run their own meetings and learn about the wider co-operative movement. We are hoping to start up more Young Cooperatives in the near future so if you are interested in starting one up or just have an idea let Mr Forster know and he can support you.


## A simple way to pass on your thoughts about the College
