# **Changes to the College Planner**

During the summer term we consulted with staff and students regarding the way that we use and the value the college planner. Feedback showed that only 10% of students in Key stage 4 used their planners and that parents of students in that age bracket felt 'Show My Homework' (SMHW) was the best way to access and participate in their child's homework and studies.

Taking into account the views from the parent consultation, and feedback we collated from SMHW we have made the decision not to issue college planners to Key Stage 4 (Years 9, 10 and 11) students, utilising the money saved in other areas of the school.

As well as the information gathered about the use of the planning and diary segment of the planner, only 6% of students in Key Stage 4 used the other areas of their planner. We have decided, however, to offer these for purchase as some students and parents may prefer them to relying on SMHW. You may purchase them through our online payment system for £2, they will be delivered to your child within their tutor period.

In Key Stage 3 (Years 7 and 8) we have decided to continue using planners following feedback from the annual transition survey and focus groups, where the majority of students and parents felt that it was a great tool for communicating with teachers and their child's tutor. Students felt that the planner helped them to settle and 'get used to the college site and lessons'. We also believe that the planners will support students in Year 8 to make GCSE option choices.
