Really interactive group sessions have helped students self reflect and consider how they present themselves to other people and the impact that they can have on peers and friends. The Sixth Form Amnesty International group at Tavistock College firmly believes in the power of words, and so our first focus this academic year has ben Amnesty's annual 'Write for Rights' campaign, where groups spanning the planet participate in the world's biggest human rights campaign by writing letters of solidarity to people who have had their human rights abused.

Keen to engage with the lower school, we organised a lesson for years seven, eight and nine, and delivered these lessons alongside English teachers. This year's theme was women defending human rights, and we explored issues such as sexuality, indigeneity and youth advocacy. Alongside postcards signed by the sixth form and staff members, the school has written around 170 letters (which were sent last week to Brazil, Northern Ireland and Myanmar, to name but a few of the campaigns), which we know will make a tangible and long-lasting difference as part of Amnesty's goal this year of seven million letters. Moving forward, the Amnesty group will be continuing their work in Key Stage Three lessons next year, and are planning a number of fundraising events. Hard work and dedication has paid off for Tavistock College student Rosie Andrews, who has retained her South West Cyclocross U16s girls' champion title for the fourth time.

Rosie, aged 14, won in a close competition at the championships which were held in Redruth.

Rosie rides for both Pilgrim Flyers, based in Plymouth, and Tavistock Wheelers youth cycling, training with both clubs during the week and then again at the weekend if not racing. The talented rider currently holds a



couple of other titles - the mountain biking SouthemXC series winner and SouthernXC champion. Rosie said 'My aim was to retain my title. The course was a mix of up and down and flat technical sections. The conditions held during the race, after the heavy rain the previous night and then light rain during the race, made the course very muddy and slippery and the climbing was hard to get a grip on the wet grass.'

Her efforts and training paid off, resulting in the win and retaining the South West Cyclo-Cross Champion title. Next year Rosie will be competing in both the Southern series and National mountain bike XC series and hopes to improve on her current ranking of seventh in the UK. Rosie said she had had excellent support from her school, parents and her coaches.

'I would not be able to compete at this level without this support, I am very grateful,' she said.

SLEEPOVER



If your child is invited to a sleepover you will want them to be safe - both in general and in the event of a fire. So before you agree here are some things that might help.

Check that your child:

- Is normally woken by and recognises the sound of a smoke alarm
 - If they don't, or they have a hearing impairment or other disability, tell the sleepover parents so that someone must wake them and/or help them in an emergency
- Knows what to do if they hear a smoke alarm go off
- Knows not to hide from fire
- Knows how to raise the alarm
- Is happy to ask about the escape plan of the place they are going to
- Will tell you if they don't feel safe

If you are in any doubt:

Reverse the sleepover and invite the friend to your home instead

And remember to:

Go through your fire plan with any guests you have staying

CHECK THAT:

- There will be a responsible adult present at all times in the property.
- There is a working smoke alarm.



Some of these questions may be uncomfortable to ask but why not look at it this way; you wouldn't dream of travelling in a car without seatbelts - they are lifesavers if there is an accident.

Working smoke alarms and escape plans are like seatbelts for sleepovers - you hope never to need them - but they must be there just in case ...
