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Welcome to the latest edition of our Fortnightly Focus for students and parents for this academic year. As we are now approaching the end of our third week back at school, and our first full week back with no en masse lateral flow testing, it seems

an appropriate time to reflect on how well the vast majority of students have settled back into school life; following what has, and continues to be, an unsettling and challenging time for everyone.

It has been lovely to see our new year 7 students adapting so well to life in secondary school. Being out in the corridors and on duties means we get to see students navigating their way around the school, asking fellow students and staff for help, and approaching classrooms and teachers for their next lessons. All of this the year 7 students have done with enthusiasm and politeness. It has also been wonderful to see the number of older students who have been volunteering (or in some cases, volunteered by staff!) to guide younger students around, show them where a specific room is, or take them with them to find a particular person. There are 4-5 of our older students who, in the first few weeks, always seemed to have a year 7 student walking with them, chatting and supporting, until they had supported them with whatever issue they were experiencing. These young people, in particular, were noticed, commended and commented on by staff, Heads of Year and many others, as really positive examples of what we aim for our students to develop into as they progress through the school.

Over the course of the last 2 weeks students across the school have been engaging with a new element of our tutor programme: The Day. During these sessions students have been discussing and learning about misinformation and fake news; a topic which is only becoming more relevant as time goes on. Feedback from tutors tells us that the students have engaged well in these sessions, and appreciated the opportunity to discuss openly a topic which they know to be important, but is often so difficult to broach. Throughout the rest of the year the tutor programme will continue to work with our young people to focus their tutor time around particular topics and issues, and we are looking forward to hearing how the students have found this approach and opportunity.

On the following pages are a number of success stories from our young people, which we are very pleased and proud to share with you. There is also, as usual, various bits of information that we will continue to distribute to ensure that you are all as informed as possible about where support is readily available and accessible.
