First Aid Provision at Tavistock College

Keeping all of our students safe and well is always our number one priority at Tavistock College. This is the only way in which students can consistently achieve well, meet their true potential and succeed whilst they are at school. It's fair to say that the Covid-19 pandemic of the last two years has provided additional challenges for the smooth running of a school. We have appreciated the support from parents and carers in helping us comply with the DfE and Public Health England guidance in terms of Covid-19 symptoms, testing and rules around self isolation.

Can I take this opportunity to clarify a few points about general first aid provision at Tavistock College:

- We have a rota of first aid staff who are 'on call' to deal with any incidents that require 'first aid' during the school day.
- We do not have a school nurse on site. Therefore, can I respectfully ask that students are not sent to school with known illnesses or health issues that require likely medical attention in the short term. You should seek medical assistance via 111 or local Doctors Surgeries as appropriate.
- Minor first aid incidents in Science, PE and Technology may be dealt with within faculty areas by first aid trained staff.
- We endeavour to support the wider mental health of our students at all times. There are various systems in place to support which include mentoring, LSO support, peer mentoring and a students wider pastoral team. A student should always be able to speak to their form tutor in the first instance if there's a problem with which they require some support.
- Please ensure that any changed contact details or phone numbers are always updated with the College. This is crucial to help us with our timely communication home as appropriate.

After retirement she was able to enjoy her hobbies of reading and visiting the island of Crete, where she spent many happy holidays with her husband Derek. Speaking to colleagues who knew her well, we all feel that she saw Tavistock College as a very important part of her life and we in turn benefitted from knowing her.

Over the past 12 weeks, in partnership with Premiership rugby club Exeter Chiefs, we have hosted Project Rugby.


