- Tavistock College Medicines Policy

  1. Where possible, it is preferable for medicines to be prescribed in frequencies that allow the pupil to take them outside of school hours.
- 2. If this is not possible, prior to staff members administering any medication, the parents/carers of the child must complete and sign a parental agreement for a school to administer medicine form.
- 3. No child will be given any prescription or non-prescription medicines without written parental consent. If parents wish their child to be given paracetamol, they should complete the relevant consent form at the start of the academic year and provide the academy with a supply of this medication with their child's name on, per 6 and 7 below.
- 4. Where a pupil is prescribed medication without their parents'/carers' knowledge, every effort will be made to encourage the pupil to involve their parents while respecting their right to confidentiality. - 5. No child under 16 years of age will be given medication containing aspirin without a doctor's prescription.
- 6. Medicines MUST be in date, labelled, and provided in the original container (except in the case of insulin which may come in a pen or pump) with dosage instructions. Medicines which do not meet these criteria will not be administered.
- 7. A maximum of four weeks supply of the medication may be provided to the school at one time.
- 8. Controlled drugs may only be taken on school premises by the individual to whom they have been prescribed. Passing such drugs to others is an offence which will be dealt with under our Drug and Alcohol Policy.
- 9. Medications will be stored in the medical room
- 10. Any medications left over at the end of the course will, if possible, be returned to the child's parents.
- 11. Written records will be kept of any medication administered to children. Appendix 4
- 12. Students will never be prevented from accessing their medication.
- 13. The School cannot be held responsible for side effects that occur when medication is taken correctly.

The Globe' London Trip

Funding advice available

A large group of year 9 -13 students went on a trip to Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London recently. It was an incredible experience where we discovered and experienced lots on a short time; we all found the architecture as well as the history, fascinating. It was interesting to know the different seat placings for the richer and poorer people in Shakespearean times and how that translated into contemporary theatre. We also found out about the different exits and entrances for characters. If, for example, a character were to exit or enter from above they were seen as going to heaven, however, if someone were to enter or exit from the trap door below the stage it would be seen as if they were going to or coming from hell. When we thought about this we could relate this to many moments in Shakespeare's work. We had a useful acting workshop with some professional actors. We focused on one particular



scene we were to see later performed in the theatre and broke down the language. pauses and possible meaning behind the words. The workshop helped us to know what was going on as the Shakespearean language can seem difficult to follow and

master. It also helped us in our own attitude to Shakespeare and text work, our acting skills and understanding how we should emphasise certain words. For the GCSE students the experience will be able to be directly referenced in their GCSE Drama written exam.


The performance we saw was 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. We were expecting it to be hard and confusing to understand, however, the actors energy and

characterisation helped the words and complicated narrative quickly started to make sense. The play was extremely well done and oddly immersive. Set in a timeless, multi-geographical location and using lots of modern day references (including taking selfies during the show!) it's clever use of regular, but fitting, audience participation constantly kept the audience drawn in and kept us deep in the world of the play, making the overall experience like none other. This audience participation included three of our own students being on stage in the pre show action and another audience member from the pit being used through the whole show to play the part of Starveling! The use of music and song (much of which was contemporary) alongside the brightly coloured costumes all added to the experience. We found the use of an open air theatre very interesting yet effective in making the play

the sound of police sirens all somehow fitted in seamlessly.

The experience of just being in Shakespeare's Globe and learning about its history was amazing and is certainly something that we will never forget......it will also probably make that essay due next week a bit easier!

## **English DMT Championships**

In March 2018 I made the difficult decision to guit Diving. Many of my skills would transfer to Trampolining so I joined City of Plymouth Trampoline Club.

After winning several regional medals, they put me forward for the English Qualifers, where the top 16 trampolinists and top 12 DMT gymnasts would go on to the English Championships in Sheffield. Finishing 17th on Trampoline I narrowly missed out, but in DMT I came top. In DMT you have to do 4 passes, in each a move onto, and then off, the curved

double mini trampoline (DMT) and then "stick" the landing.

I prepared 4 passes each containing 2 double somersaults, the maximum difficulty allowed at my level. I was very nervous as I knew everyone would have improved, and I wasn't wrong – the competition was fierce!

On my 3rd pass I was given a massive deduction and I didn't know why, neither did my Coach. We could appeal, but I would have to do my last pass first. So I had to re-focus and do my best and thankfully I nailed it. Then the agonising wait.

Phew, the judges had made a mistake. I had won! I was so happy. I now hold the title of Men's age 15-16 English Silver DMT Champion. Better than any title I ever won at Diving and only my first season. This year I hope to compete at Gold (Elite) Level.

### Judo Success

Lottie Hay in year 9 recently attended the Welsh Schools Championships, representing Tavistock College. She competed really well and won a gold medal. This gives her priority entry into the British Schools Championships, to be held in Sheffield in March. The competition continues for Lottie, and other Tavistock students Reuben Frise and Alanna Hopkins who will be competing this coming weekend at the Commonwealth Championships.

Lottie is also working towards a training opportunity with the Western Area Judo Squad. If selected she will have 10 days training in Japan in Spring 2021. The training

will be at the Kodokan, the home of Judo. staving lodgings there and eating, sleeping and breathing Judo!
